Community Business & Service Resources: Note: This is not an exhaustive list of resources. Some resources in each area are listed to give a place to begin searching for assistance. Many other resources exist, and most places in any category can provide more referrals.

- 1. If you're out of a job or struggling financially, you're not alone.
 - a. Almost everyone has been out of a job at some time or other.
 - **b.** Being out of your previous job may actually be a positive thing to boost you toward another, better job or training or position.
- 2. **Network** –Statistically, most jobs are located through people you know:

 - ii. Keep looking for the job you really want.
- **b.** Loans, Mortgages, Preventing Foreclosure, Credit Card debt—Counseling regarding how to handle debt payments.
